Tuition exemption for students in or formerly in nonrelative custody

INFORMATIONAL MEMORANDUM

PURPOSE: This memorandum provides clarification about the implementation of a new law, passed during the 2014 legislative session, expanding the provision of the tuition fee exemption to students who are or were in the custody of a nonrelative under section 39.5085, Florida Statutes, at the time he or she reached 18 years of age.

BACKGROUND: During the 2014 session, the Legislature approved an amendment to section 1009.25, Florida Statutes, to read:

1009.25 Fee exemptions.—

- (1) The following students are exempt from the payment of tuition and fees, including lab fees, at a school district that provides workforce education programs, Florida College System institution, or state university:
- (d) A student who is or was at the time he or she reached 18 years of age in the custody of a relative <u>or nonrelative</u> under s. 39.5085 or who was adopted from the Department of Children and Families Family Services after May 5, 1997. Such exemption includes fees associated with enrollment in applied academics for adult education instruction. The exemption remains valid until the student reaches 28 years of age.

Based on the July 1, 2014 effective date of the law, the tuition exemption is available for students ages 18-27 who were in the custody of a nonrelative pursuant to section 39.5085, Florida Statutes, on his or her 18th birthday.

Form CF-FSP 5220 has been updated for Community-Based Care Lead Agencies to use to certify that a student receiving or formerly receiving services meets one of the following

criteria necessary to obtain exemption from paying tuition and fees at a Florida public state university, public Florida College System institution or public postsecondary career and technical program, pursuant to the "Florida K-20 Education Code," section 1009.25(1)(c)-(d), Florida Statutes:

- □ He or she is or was at the time he or she reached age 18 in the custody of the Department of Children and Families;
- He or she was adopted from the Department of Children and Families after May 5, 1997;
- □ He or she is or was at the time of reaching age 18 in the custody of a relative under s. 39.5085, F.S.;
- □ He or she is or was at the time of reaching age 18 in the custody of a non-relative under s. 39.5085, F.S.; or
- He or she was placed in a guardianship by the court after spending at least 6 months in the custody of the department after reaching 16 years of age.
