

WITHIN FIRST 30 DAYS OF EMPLOYMENT: My 30 day deadline:	1 YEAR AFTER STARTING TRAINING My 1 year (training) deadline:
Fire Extinguisher Training: You must complete training in the use and operation of a fire extinguisher. DCF's Child Care Personnel Orientation Course (5 hours) provides general information on this topic that may be used to supplement a facility specific training offered by the child care provider. Safe Sleep/Shaken Baby Syndrome Training: If you work in a facility that offers care to infants, you must have training regarding guidance on safe sleep practices and preventing shaken baby syndrome. DCF Health, Safety and Nutrition (8 hours) OR DCF Safe Sleep Practices for Child Care (1 hour) OR Early Learning Florida's Safe Sleep Practices (1 hour) WITHIN FIRST 90 DAYS OF EMPLOYMENT: My 90 day deadline:	All the 40-hour required training must be completed one year from the date your training began. You must pass competency exams for the 40 hours of training or receive an educational exemption. PART I (30 hours) Child Care Facility Rules and Regulations (6 hours) Health Safety and Nutrition (8 hours) Identifying and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect (4 hours) Child Growth and Development (6 hours) Behavioral Observation and Screening (6 hours) PART II (10 HOURS) Understanding Developmentally Appropriate Practices (5 hours) AND one (1) of the following: Olifant and Toddler Appropriate Practices (5 hours) Oreschool Appropriate Practices (5 hours) School-Age Appropriate Practices (5 hours) OR Special Needs Appropriate Practices (10 hours)
You must begin training within the first 90 days of employment in the child care industry by: • starting a Part I or Part II course (40-hour required training), • taking a child care competency exam, or • earning an educational exemption	ADDITIONAL TRAINING TIMEFRAMES Prior to Caring for Children: You are required to be educated on your facility's exposure plan regarding standard precautions for children before beginning to work and annually there-after.
WITHIN 1 YEAR OF EMPLOYMENT: My 1 year (employment) deadline:	Prior to Providing Medication or Transportation: You are required to complete mandatory training before providing transportation or administrating medication to children.
Early Literacy: Complete 5 hours of literacy training through one of the following: • Early Literacy for Children Birth to Three (5 hours) online course • Emergent Literacy for Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten	Annual In-Service Training, July 1 – June 30: You are required to complete a minimum of 10 hours or 1.0 Continuing Education Unit (CEU) of in service during the state's fiscal year, July 1 and ending June 30.
