# **Provider & Community Partner Updates:**

- The Welcoming Basket Donation Drive is underway at Largo and Barbara S. Ponce Libraries in Pinellas County. Items for kitchen, bathroom, children's, and baby baskets will be collected throughout the entire month of September and given to refugee families in early October.
- Lutheran Services, Florida (LSF) announced that they have applied to assist 75 Afghans through the special program set up for those given humanitarian parole and Gulf Coast Jewish Family & Community Services (GCJFCS) has already had a few Afghan arrivals. LSF also reported that of the Cuban/Haitian border crossers they are serving, an increasing number are unemployable.
- USF continues to provide free, in-home covid vaccines to refugees ages 12+ and over 80 individuals have bene fully vaccinated through this program.
- The CARIBE adult education program is launching new vocational training programs that are at no cost to clients and will train them to be nursing assistants and pharmacy techs.
