



CCBHC Model

Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics (CCBHCs) are non-profit organizations that provide integrated health care for individuals and families with behavioral health conditions who are underserved, indigent, insured, uninsured, or on Medicaid, regardless of ability to pay. They provide a minimum of nine types of services directly, or through contract with partner organizations, with an emphasis on the provision of 24-hour crisis care, evidence-based practices, care coordination and integration with physical health care.

This is system transformation, not another "new program." The CCBHC Model is built on the concept that the way to expand and improve behavioral health care is to pay for the activities that make those goals possible! How is this accomplished?



■ Florida Impact¹

- Incarcerations in correctional facilities decreased 92%.
- Hospitalizations for mental health care decreased 69%.
- The number of patients reporting serious psychological distress decreased 27%.

■ National Impact²

- On average, CCBHCs are serving 23% more people than prior to CCBHC implementation.
- 32% of CCBHCs provide same-day access to care, 71% provide appointment within one week, and 87% see clients within 10 days (national average is 48 days).
- On average CCBHCs added 27 new staff per clinic.


