SUBJECT: Auditor General 2005-2006 Audit Findings for Title IV-E Adoption Assistance

and Foster Care Program

The Office of the Auditor General has completed its annual audit of the Title IV-E Foster Care and Adoption Assistance program for the state fiscal year ending June 30, 2006. Attached is an electronic copy of the findings that pertains to the Region. For the SunCoast Region, eight cases were determined ineligible for federal financial participation. The specific reasons for ineligibility were: (1) no documentation of a removal court order with the judicial finding that remaining in the home would be contrary to the welfare of the child, (2) no documentation that local, state and national criminal background checks were completed on foster care providers, (3) no documentation verifying that safety requirements were met in regard to the staff and caretakers of child caring agencies, (4) a Title IV-E payment made to a an adoptive parent was lower than the amount agreed to in the adoption assistance agreement, and (5) Title IV-E payment was made to an ineligible foster care provider. The costs to be reimbursed to the Title IV-E grant are indicated on the attachment.

Please have the appropriate staff in the Community-Based Care (CBC) lead agency complete the following steps:

(1) "back out" ineligible Title IV-E payments indicated on the attachment and forward copies of completed prior year adjustment paperwork to:

- (2) make the appropriate corrections to the case file and in HomeSafenet and ICWSIS to reflect the child's accurate eligibility status;
- (3) identify steps that will be taken to ensure that only eligible expenses for eligible children will be charged to the Title IV-E grant;
- (4) develop and submit a corrective action plan. The plan must include, at a minimum.
 - (a) the specific findings outlined above,
 - (b) corrective actions to be taken to address these findings (that is, how the region and the CBC agencies will ensure that Title IV-E payments are made only when the Department has obtained appropriate removal court orders with the required judicial findings of contrary to the welfare of the child; that required background screenings and affidavits of compliance are completed and documented prior to issuance of the initial license and/or renewal of license; that adoptive parents receive the Title IV-E payments agreed to in the adoption assistance agreement; and that Title IV-E payments are made to eligible providers on behalf of eligible children. Documentation of the court orders, criminal background checks, affidavits of compliance and appropriate payments must be available for audits/reviews),
 - (c) a contact person responsible for for coordinating, documenting and reporting progress toward fulfilling corrective action plan, and
 - (d) the anticipated completion date.

To prepare the department's response to the findings and submit it to the Office of the Auditor General within the 30-day statutory deadline, we must receive the corrective action plan and documentation of the prior year adjustment in the Office of Family Safety by February 19, 2007.
