**SUBJECT:** Adoption of Chapter 65C-45, F.A.C., Levels of Licensure and repeal of  
CFOP 170-11, Chapter 16, Levels of Licensure

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**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this memorandum is to advise that CFOP 170-11 Chapter 16, Levels of Licensure, has been repealed and replaced with Chapter 65C-45, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.)

**BACKGROUND:** Section 409.175, Florida Statutes, gives the department rule making authority to develop policy related to the licensing of family foster homes. The new rules aligns with Florida's Levels of Licensure as outlined in Florida Statutes.

Chapter 65C-45, F.A.C., titled Levels of Licensure, has been adopted and became effective on April 26, 2020; this rule supersedes CFOP 170-11, Chapter 16. The rule can be viewed in its entirety at: <https://www.flrules.org/gateway/ChapterHome.asp?Chapter=65C-45>
