SUBJECT: Child Intake County Assignment Practice – Delay in Change

PURPOSE: The purpose of this memorandum is to communicate the continuation of the Hotline's current practice for assigning intakes to the county where the child is currently located, or to the county where the child is a resident when the child is currently out of state.

SCOPE: This policy applies to all Hotline and Child Protective Investigation Staff.

BACKGROUND: Earlier communications regarding implementation of the Safety Methodology have included discussions about changing child intake county assignment practice effective January 1, 2014. This memorandum is to advise all Hotline and Child Protective Investigation staff that the proposed change to child intake county assignment, from where the child is currently located or a resident of to where the alleged maltreatment occurred, is being delayed.

Delaying this policy change will allow for:

- 1. Development of a statewide process to implement case transfers.
- 2. Development and testing of dual profiles in FSFN that will allow cases to be worked in both the current and new practice models.
- 3. Analysis of impact of information collection in the six information domains by Hotline counselors.

ACTION REQUIRED: Please communicate to all child investigative staff that the Hotline will continue the current practice of assigning intakes to the county where the child is currently located. The Office of Child Welfare will coordinate with Operations to update you on the status of this proposed policy change.
