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Youth and Young Adult Outcomes

- Increase financial self-sufficiency
- Improve educational (academic or vocational) attainment
- Increase connections with supportive adults
- Reduce homelessness
- Reduce high-risk behavior
- Improve access to health insurance



Independent Living Services

- Services to assist older children in foster care and <u>young adults</u> who were formerly in foster care
 - Obtain life skills and education for independent living and employment
 - Have a quality of life appropriate for their age, and assume personal responsibility for becoming self-sufficient adults

Independent Living Services Young Adult Programs

- Extended Foster Care (EFC)
- Postsecondary Education Services and Support (PESS)

Aftercare Services

EFC Overview

Continued care for young adults

- Youth ages out in the legal custody of the Department
- Court maintains jurisdiction, providing judicial reviews
- Young adult continues participating in a qualifying activity

- Young adult resides in an approved supervised living arrangement
- Case management agencies coordinate services, provide home visits, and supervision
- Young adults transition to independence

Qualifying Activities for Extended Foster Care

- Completing secondary education or program leading to equivalent credential
- Enrolled in an institution which provides post-secondary or vocational education
- Participating in a program or activity designed to promote, or remove barriers to employment

- Employed for a least 80 hours per month
- Unable to participate in any of the programs or activities due to a physical, intellectual, emotional, or psychiatric condition that impairs ability to perform one or more life activities, limiting participation

Aftercare Services

Eligibility Overview

- 18 years of age but not yet 23
- In the legal custody of the Department on 18th birthday
- Not in EFC or PESS

Types of Services or referrals

- Mentoring
- Tutoring
- Mental Health
- Substance Abuse
- Counseling
- Temporary Financial Assistance



Postsecondary Educational Services and Support (PESS)

Eligibility Overview

- 18 but not yet 23 years of age
- Living in legal custody of the Department on 18th birthday AND spent a total of 6 months in licensed care prior to aging out
- OR was at least 16 and was adopted or placed with court-approved dependency guardian after spending 6 months in licensed care within the 12 months immediately preceding such placement or adoption
 - AND earned a high school diploma or its equivalent
 - AND has been admitted for enrollment full-time (9 credit hours) in Florida Bright Futures eligible postsecondary educational institution

PESS

Eligibility continued

- Has submitted applied for any other grants and scholarships
- Has submitted FAFSA
- Has signed an agreement to allow the access to school records
- Has completed an application with necessary documentation

Eligibility Ends

- Not meeting academic progress at renewal, with certain exceptions
- Aged out, turned 23 years of age
- Eligibility may end before the renewal period if no longer enrolled or is no longer a resident of Florida.
- No longer a resident of the state of Florida.

PESS cont'd

Depending on certain statutory conditions, eligible youth may receive a monthly financial payment of **\$1,256**;

- The financial award is to secure housing, utilities, and assist with cost of living while attending a Florida Bright Futures-eligible postsecondary educational institution.
- This may include applicable Education and Training Voucher (ETV) funding.

HOW TO QUALIFY

- Youth or young adult is between 15-21 years old
- Meet one of the following criteria:
 - Have an open dependency case that includes out of home care OR
 - Achieved court ordered permanency within the last six months (Adoption, Reunification, Legal Guardianship)

AND:

- Have the approval of a primary caregiver who would use the same standard that they
 would use for their own child we call this the Prudent Parenting Standard
- Meet the Florida Department of Highway and Motor Vehicle Safety (DHMVS) requirements for a learners intermediate or full privilege drivers license

REQUIREMENTS

- Enrolled and attending postsecondary program at least 9 credit hours for Fall and Spring semesters or equivalent full academic year for vocational/tech program(s).
- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.3
- Communicate at least twice monthly with designated AOK Specialist for status updates on education, housing, employment and overall wellbeing.
- Provide AOK Specialist with transcripts, reports, and certificates as requested to determine continued eligibility for the program.
