New CFOP for Child Placement Agreements

Replaces CFOP 175-88, Prevention and Placement of Child Victims and Aggressors Involved in Child-On-Child Sexual Abuse, Sexual Assault, Seduction or Exploitation in Substitute Care (March, 1999)



New CFOP for Child Placement Agreements

Anchored in rule changes already effective:

F.A.C. 65C-30.001 & 65C-30.011 (2/25/2016)

F.A.C. 65C-28.004 (5/8/2016)

➤ September 12, 2016 Effective Date of New CFOP to allow time for implementation

Out of Home Plan (in FSFN)
Sexual Safety Plan
Child Placement Agreement

- > Care Precautions
- Behavior Management Plan



Child Placement Agreements: What has changed?

- > Less restrictive options
 - ☐ Care Precautions
 - Behavior Management Plan
- > Provisions to terminate Agreements
- ➤ Consideration of sibling groups
- ➤ Recognize limitations of initial placement information
- > Exceptions process

What requirements are similar?

- > Must be established at the time of placement
- > Full information disclosure to caregiver(s)
- Not required for child in a specialized treatment facility
- "Prevention Rules"
- The caregiver must have access to a case manager, supervisor, or provider agency if assistance is needed



Child Placement Agreement: Care Precautions

- ➤ Alleged or known victim of sexual abuse or CSEC
- ➤ Child with Problematic Sexual Behaviors
- ➤ Serious behaviors in past (over 1 year ago)
- ➤ Stepping down from Behavior Management Plan



Child Placement Agreement: Care Precautions

- ➤ A child shall be placed in a private bedroom until the child is known to the caregivers unless:
 - The child is being placed with siblings and there are no concerns for the safety of anyone in the sibling group.
 - A separate bedroom is not possible and the caregiver(s) agree to careful and frequent monitoring of sleeping arrangements in order to inform ongoing supervision needs.
 - Qualified assessor indicates a private bedroom is not necessary.



Child Placement Agreement for Behavior Management Plan

> Juvenile Sexual Behaviors

➤ Behaviors that are a Significant Threat to Others



Behavior Management Plan Placement Requirements: Initial

- > The child must be the youngest child living in the home.
- A physically or sexually aggressive child must not be placed in a bedroom with a more vulnerable child.
- The child's bedroom must have an alarm or other alerting device for the door when there are concerns for the safety of the child or other children in the home during the times when caregivers are sleeping.
- > The child must receive sight and sound supervision.



Behavior Management Plan Placement Requirements: Ongoing

- An assessment by a qualified assessor must be received within 30 days of a child's placement, and the requirements in the Agreement must be modified as necessary.
- Modifications may include:
 - Changes to the use of space, routines and house rules;
 - Positive reinforcement, de-escalation techniques and therapeutic activities; or,
 - The actions and assistance that will be provided to support the caregiver.
 - The caregiver's agreement to assist in the identification of any triggers or antecedents that appear to be associated the child's self-harming behavior or inappropriate behaviors towards other children.

Brevard Family

Monitoring Child Placement Agreements

- During routine CM contacts:
 - Input on whether the requirements are working or not working
 - Implementation of any new house rules, interventions or treatment
 - Any incidents of harm to other children in the home
 - Additional supports needed



Terminate Child Placement Agreement

Based on an evaluation by a qualified assessor

and

The absence of concerning behaviors which threaten the safety of other children in the home or the child



Implementation Activities

- > Assess for any updates needed to local protocols
- > Identification of qualified assessors
- ➤ Review current cases with sexual safety plans and identify continued need(s) or termination.
- ➤ Identify children with significant behaviors who need plans.



Child Placement Agreement Template/FSFN Design

The template will be pilot tested to inform FSFN design in January 2017.

> FSFN design will include placement alerts.

➤ BFP has discretion to use local forms/templates until FSFN functionality is available.



Implementation Activities Pilot Sites

- > Testing of draft templates August 1, 2016.
- ➤ Gather and document feedback from frontline users, including supervisors.
- ➤ Participate in a statewide conference call every two weeks to share and discuss findings and any actions needed.
- ➤ Participate in a peer review to be conducted by OCW and the FCC-COO of a small sample of cases.
- In early December, participate in Pilot Project wrap-up meeting.
- ➤ In January, 2017, participate in the final FSFN design.


Court ordered placement restrictions exist.


