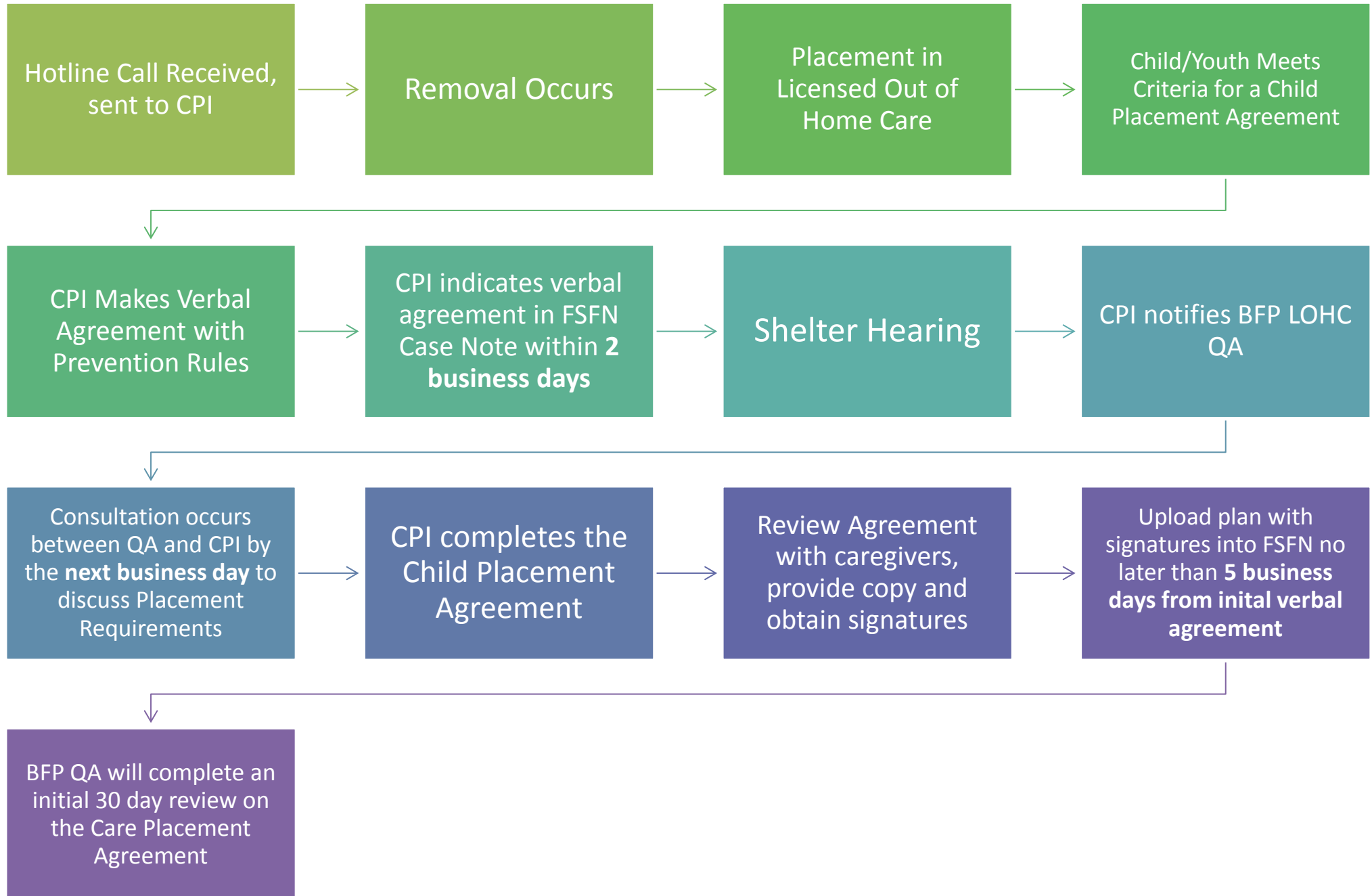


Child Placement Agreement Work Flow



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Child Placement Agreement

Must be established at the time of placement when there are allegations, or known behaviors such as: 1) Juvenile Sexual Abuse Behaviors or Problematic Sexual Behavior 2) Behavior(s) that are significant threat to other children 3) Victims of Sexual Abuse or Human Trafficking (CSEC)

Qualified Assessor

BFP Relative/Non-Relative QA: Gathering of information by a clinical professional to assess the symptoms or behaviors to determine need for Care Placement Agreement.

Child Placement Agreements

Behavior Management Plan

Required for children who have demonstrated any of the following behaviors within the past 12 months

- 1) Juvenile Sexual Behaviors
- 2) Behaviors that are a Significant Threat to Others

Care Precaution Plan

Required for:

- 1) Alleged or known victim of sexual abuse
- 2) Child exhibits problematic sexual behaviors
- 3) Victim of Human Trafficking (CSEC) but does not display Juvenile Sexual Behaviors, Significant threat to others, or Severe Self Harm behaviors
- 4) Known to have exhibited Juvenile Sexual Behaviors or Behaviors that are a Significant Threats to Others when:
 - a) Behavior occurred more than 1 year ago, or
 - b) Has been in treatment, has had a Behavior Management Plan and based on child's progress, treatment provider recommends stepping down the level of restrictions.
