

Going Public with Private Adoptions

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ADOPTION ASSISTANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Permanent commitment to the Department or licensed child-placing agency
- Specific factor that makes it difficult to place the child for adoption - member of a sibling group that must be placed together for adoption, age 8 or older, physical or emotional handicap, developmentally disabled, black or racially mixed, or significant emotional ties to foster parent

- Documentation of reasonable but unsuccessful efforts to place without subsidy except for when child is being adopted by foster parent or relative caregiver
- US citizen or qualified noncitizen
- Under 18 years old
- Never emancipated
- Prospective adoptive parent(s) of the child meet background check requirements

PRIVATE ATTORNEYS & AGENCIES NOT LICENSED BY THE DEPARTMENT

- The child must be determined SSI eligible (prior to the adoption) or
- If the child was receiving adoption subsidy in a previous adoption and it dissolved as a result of a termination of parental rights or adoptive parent dies AND
- It was determined that the child continues to meet characteristics to support special needs in the subsequent adoption

FLORIDA ADOPTION ASSISTANCE



INITIAL CONTACT

Families are to apply directly to CBC where they currently reside.

- Licensed or Non-Licensed
- Pending or Finalized Adoption



COMMUNICATION

Determine who will be completing the steps at your CBC and the POC for the family.

If the request for subsidy is after finalization has occurred, a recommended denial must be sent to DCF Regional staff.



GATHERING INFORMATION

All information required to process subsidy must be collected by the parties requesting subsidy.

- Orders
- Home Study
- Proof of Special Needs
- Proof of SSI
- Reasonable Efforts
- Background checks, etc.


Complete necessary pages in FSFN regarding Private Adoption

- Post Adoption Case




PRIVATE ADOPTION PAGE

- Private agency or attorney created as a FSFN Provider and linked.
- AFCAR (red) values must be documented.
- Adoption Details fields are not documented until after finalization.
- Complete checkbox is not marked until case is ready to create Post-Adoption case.



PRIVATE ADOPTION PAGE

- Supervisors have the ability to deselect the Complete checkbox when data correction is necessary.
- Void functionality exists when page is created in error or duplicate pages exist.



TITLE IV-E ELIGIBILITY PATHS- APPLICABLE CHILD

- Special Needs child must meet one of the following:
 - At the time adoption proceedings were initiated, the child was in the care of the department or licensed private child placement agency pursuant to-
 - (a) A court-ordered removal of the child with a judicial determination that continuation in the home would be contrary to the welfare of the child; or
 - (b) A voluntary placement agreement or voluntary relinquishment
 - The child meets all medical and disability requirements of supplemental security benefits; or
 - The child was residing in a foster care with their minor parent, and the minor parent was in foster care pursuant to 1.(a) or 1.(b); or
 - The child was IV-E eligible in a prior adoption

TITLE IV-E ELIGIBILITY PATH- NON-APPLICABLE CHILD

Special Needs child must meet one of the following:

- The child was removed and placed in foster care through a voluntary placement agreement to which federal payment was provided or court-ordered removal with a judicial determination that continuation in the home would be contrary to the welfare of the child, and met AFDC criteria; or
- The child meets all requirements of supplemental security benefits; or
- The child was residing in foster care with their minor parent and the minor parent's board payment covered the cost of the child; or
- The child was IV-E eligible in a prior adoption



TITLE IV-E ELIGIBILITY **PATHS NOT APPLICABLE CHILD**

Per the Children's Bureau, this guidance should continue to be utilized since FFPSA has delayed the phase-in of Applicable Child.



Is a child who is voluntarily relinquished to a private, nonprofit agency eligible for title IV-E adoption assistance as a child who is not an "applicable child"

(Deleted 10/25/2017)

Answer

As authorized by section 473(a)(2)(A)(i)(I) of the Act, a child is eligible for title IVE adoption assistance if s/he is removed from the home by way of a voluntary placement agreement with respect to which title IV-E foster care payments are provided, or as the result of a judicial determination that to remain in the home would be contrary to the child's welfare. However, a child who is voluntarily relinquished to either a public or private, nonprofit agency will be considered judicially removed in the following circumstances:

- (1) the child is voluntarily relinquished either to the State agency (or another public agency (including Tribes) with whom the State has a title IV-E agreement), or to a private, nonprofit agency; and
- (2) there is a petition to the court to remove the child from home within six months of the time the child lived with a specified relative; and
- (3) there is a subsequent judicial determination to the effect that remaining in the home would be contrary to the child's welfare.

Under these circumstances, the AFDC-eligible child will be treated as though s/he was judicially removed rather than voluntarily relinquished. If the State agency subsequently determines that the child also meets the three criteria in the definition of a child with special needs in section 473(c) of the Act, the child is eligible for title IV-E adoption assistance. If, however, there is no petition to remove the child from the home or no subsequent judicial determination, the child cannot be considered judicially removed for the purpose of title IV-E adoption assistance eligibility. Furthermore, if the court merely sanctions the voluntary relinquishment without making a determination that it is contrary to the child's welfare to remain in the home, the child is not eligible for title IV-E adoption assistance.

 - New eligibility page will generate upon creation of the Private Adoption page
 - Complete eligibility based upon removal by the Department

 - Create an AAA to autogenerate an Adoption Eligibility page
 - Complete Adoption Eligibility
