#### What is Florida NYTD?

Florida NYTD is a survey comprised of questions from the Federal National Youth in Transition Database (NYTD), the Florida IL Checklist and questions developed by youth, young adults, the Department and other stakeholders in the child welfare system.

Beginning in August of 2016 the Office of Child Welfare (OCW) began a comprehensive review of the administration of the Florida NYTD Survey. The goal is to move toward a more user-friendly survey, one that will not only appropriately capture the young adult voice but inform all licensed caregivers and Child Welfare Professionals on their practices strengths and needs.

In phase one, OCW eliminated questions were either no longer applicable or provided information that could be gathered utilizing another data source.

In May of 2017, OCW facilitated a workgroup with pertinent stakeholders, gathering critical feedback and recommendations. Efforts are still underway to revamp survey administration and tools.

### Who takes the Florida NYTD Survey?

Young people ages 18-22, who turned 18 in licensed foster care are the identified survey population. Many of the young adults completing the survey are receiving services through Florida's *Extended Foster Program*, *Postsecondary Education Services and Supports* and/or *Aftercare*.

The survey can be completed on-line, on paper or by telephone. The Spring 2017, Florida NYTD survey was administered from April 15<sup>th</sup> —June 17<sup>th</sup>, 2017

#### Positive Pathways Program

PPP was created by the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) to improve postsecondary outcomes and career transitions for former foster youth who are attending Florida's public post-secondary educational system. Many of these students are eligible for the state's generous tuition and fee exemption, which allows colleges, universities, and technical colleges to waive costs of students' education.

Because adequate support and guidance is as important as funding to educational success, the Florida Legislature, in 2013, mandated that DCF collaborate with the Board of Governors (BOG), the Florida College System (FCS), and the Florida Department of Education (DOE) to help eligible youth transition to and through post-secondary educational settings (Chapter 409, Florida Statutes).

Earlier this year, DCF contracted with Educate Tomorrow Corporation (ET), a 501(c)(3) organization, to manage the program. PPP partners with Florida Reach, the state-wide volunteer initiative that was co-founded by DCF, in 2013. ET has established a strong foundation upon which PPP can build a program comprised of the foster care liaisons recently appointed by the BOG and FCS.
