2. Approaches to Examining the System of Care

Secretary Shevaun Harris, Chair

- There was a general discussion around ensuring that the subcommittee consider geographic differences/variations when reviewing the key components for a healthy system .
- 3. Data Overview: Understanding the System of Care from a Crisis Lens Amanda Regis, Statewide Baker Act and Marchman Act Coordinator
- Amanda Regis provided an overview of the Baker Act process, data, and elements of a modern crisis care system. Ms. Regis utilized the system of care in Broward as an example of one that has also resulted in a reduction in the number of Baker Act admissions over the last few years.
- Austin Noll requested fiscal year 2018- 2019 Baker Act data.
- Using Broward as the example, Secretary Harris asked the committee if they believed any components were potentially missing from the array.

4. Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics

Rebecca Farley David, National Council for Wellbeing, provided an overview of the CCBHC Model.

- There was a consistent response from the subcommittee members in further exploring the CCBHC model and its potential benefits in addressing challenges faced in Florida.
- The group discussed the possibility of including further expansion of the model in Florida as a potential recommendation for the Interim Report, but further discussion would be needed.
- Mary Mayhew stated that there may be value in combining the available CCBHC data with other existing data to get a better outlook..
