I. CALL TO ORDER

Cristina Perez called to order the Southern Region Behavioral Health Interagency Collaboration at 10:30am on November 13, 2025. This meeting was held virtually.

II. WELCOME

Lourdes Dorado-Rubio, Regional Operations Manager for the DCF Office of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (SAMH) welcomed the attendees. The following individuals provided introductions:

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III. PRESENTATION

Angela Mooss and Jack Vertovec, from BSRI, provided a presentation on the "Results for the Southern Region Triennial Need Assessment" and Laura M. Naredo, provided a brief overview of the services offered by TMSF, background information on the Managing Entities' (ME) contractual obligation to perform a Triennial Needs Assessment, and how the assessment results are incorporated into the ME's Enhancement Plan.

Laura M. Naredo provided an overview including what is a ME and, on the services, offered by TMSF, the ME for SNR. Laura explained how the state requires the ME to complete a needs assessment every three years. TMSF has partnered, for the first time, with Behavioral Science Research Institute (BSRI) staff Angela and Jack, who provided a review of the assessment research that was completed during the summer months and the findings that were produced from that assessment. These needs assessments results contribute to an annual Enhancement Plan that is submitted to the Department by the ME.

Angela Mooss shared key findings among survey and focus groups consisting of community stakeholders in the southern region. The findings, as summarized by BSRI, included: Lack of awareness of services by the community & existing stigma in accessing services, accessing services only after a crisis, a need for additional care coordination, a need for additional children's services, increased suicide prevention, increased peer support and peer utilization in Behavioral Health settings and lack of affordable housing.

Jack Vertovec shared the Community Engagement Themes of the Town Hall Findings.

Questions and Answers:

Courtney Phillips, Health Care District of Palm Beach County: Thanked the presenters and asked how the findings of the assessment will be utilized.

Laura M. Naredo, Thriving Mind South Florida: provided a brief explanation on how the assessment results were utilized to respond in four key areas which were included in TMSF Enhancement Plan. These areas included: Additional funding for Housing, Children's Respite Services, Children's Crisis Unit (CSU) in South Miami-Dade and Monroe County and for additional Evidence-Based Training in Peer/recovery systems, the Daily Living Activities (DLA) -20, and The Transition to Independence Process (TIP) Model

Angela Mooss, Behavioral Science Research Institute: stated they met with TMSF every other week with updates and pressing issues.

Jack Vertovec, Behavioral Science Research Institute: mentioned more details contained in the report have more specific and detailed key recommendations that came from the focus groups and town halls discussions. He shared that he has already noticed certain



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recommendations have already been implemented, in some way, such as the resource guide the ME recently updated and published. Shared that as internal evaluators he was impressed with the response.

Laura M. Naredo, Thriving Mind South Florida: mentioned how the findings don't end at the Enhancement Plan but also continue to inform the ME's Strategic Plan, a three (3) to five (5)-year plan, that includes shared goals, marketing materials, access to services or creating new services like in previous years. Laura provided the example of the "Living Room" Model, at New Horizons CMHC, which came to fruition through the ME's previous Enhancement and Strategic Plans. Expressed that TMSF will continue to take the findings from each Triennial Needs Assessment to craft and improve on services within the community.

Courtney Phillips, Health Care District of Palm Beach County: How do we bridge the gap between Silos an IT integration between social systems and health care systems including school systems?

Angela Mooss, Behavioral Science Research Institute: Mentioned that while IT Integration did not present as a specific challenge for Miami Dade, during this Triennial Needs Assessment, from the work that they have done in other areas, they acknowledged that IT integration is a challenge that exist. She reiterated that the biggest gap identified in Miami Dade was the lack of available units that could be rented at a price that someone on a disability or on a fixed income could afford that also offered services on site.

Dr. Mari C Rodriguez, Iman's Light Foundation: How do we access some funds to continue to provide services that are being requested by schools and parents?

Lourdes Dorado-Rubio, DCF SAMH: mentioned this is the purpose for these Regional Behavioral Health Interagency collaboratives, to discuss items like these. Advised that for the upcoming year, 2026, we will be discussing the creation of work groups or specialized subcommittees to be able to do a deep dive into some of these areas.

The presentation was shared with all members on the Southern Regional Collaborative email distribution list. In addition, the contact information for presenters were included in the presentation.

IV. IMPACTFUL MOMENTS

Lourdes Dorado-Rubio, DCF SAMH, shared a Southern Regional success story from two providers who wanted to highlight the work being performed at Thriving Mind South Florida,



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the Managing Entity. Providers who shared their collaborative relationship with the ME included the Guidance/Care Center from Monroe County and New Horizon's Community Mental Health Center in Miami-Dade County.

V. NEXT STEPS AND 2026 VISON

Lourdes Dorado-Rubio, DCF SAMH, shared the vision of the SNR Regional Behavioral Health Interagency Collaborative (RBHIC), for the year 2026, emphasizing a region-specific approach that will allow us to set goals, outcomes, and measurable actions for our counties. The RBHIC will begin forming sub-collaboratives to address regional gaps identified in 2025. Quarterly full collaborative meetings will return to in-person sessions at the downtown DCF Visionary Conference Room with an emphasis on networking. A virtual option will be included to accommodate those who cannot attend in-person.

The team is currently determining presenters for the 2026 quarterly meetings, and the agenda will be released once finalized. Members are encouraged to submit topic and presenter suggestions to snr.samh.support@myflfamilies.com by November 30th.

A future survey will be distributed to gather additional topic ideas and areas of interest.

The collaborative will continue its overarching goal of "Strengthening Community Networks and Cross-Agency Collaboration," which is aligned with the Commission's report.
