I. CALL TO ORDER

Erinn Izykowski, Regional Operations Supervisor (ROS), Substance Abuse and Mental Health (SAMH) Program Office, Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) called to order the SunCoast Regional Behavioral Health Interagency Collaboration (RBHIC) at 10:01 a.m. on November 4, 2025.

II. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

- Introductions to SAMH staff and Central Florida Behavioral Health Network (CFBHN) presenter.

III. PRESENTATION- Managing Entity, Central Florida Behavioral Health Network Lizette Tabares, Vice President of Behavioral Health Services, CFBHN

- CFBHN Needs Assessment, conducted every three years for SCR and Circuit 10 (Central Region) and acts as a roadmap for growth.
- CFBHN is the largest Managing Entity (ME) by population size; and the second largest by land mass in Florida, serving 14 counties (Circuits 6, 10, 12, 13, and 20) with the smallest



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county being Glades (just over 13,000 residents). CFBHN serves the largest number of uninsured and underinsured individuals in Florida.

- CFBHN submits approximately 50% of all statewide SAMH data.
- Strategies to decrease waitlists: daily reviews, monitoring bed utilization, embedding behavioral health consultants with community organizations.
- Opioid settlement funding: 40% increase in funding over the last three years, leading to expanded outreach and engagement.
- Peer workforce expansion: adding new Recovery Community Organizations, peer certification training, and ongoing technical assistance; monthly Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC) learning communities, and weekly support meetings.
- Needs assessment results: 175 respondents—94% reported services improved their quality of life, but stigma, financial constraints, and transportation remain major barriers.
- Housing initiatives: Jersey Commons project in Polk County supporting high utilizers.
- Goals identified in the Needs Assessment include reducing restrictive funding for high utilizers, expanding public awareness campaigns, and expand social media efforts to reduce stigma through help-seeking storytelling and education.

V. NEXT STEPS AND 2026 VISION

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- Over the past sessions we have had many organizations attend hearing multiple
 perspectives in identifying and addressing ongoing opportunities within the
 behavioral health system at the local level to Improve the accessibility,
 availability, and quality of behavioral health services. Statewide RBHIC have
 identified themes of service accessibility and capacity, funding flexibility, need for
 more housing, and increasing peer support services.
- Supportive and Intensive Behavioral Health services which are relating to
 housing: The Agency is preparing a 1915(i)-state plan amendment to add
 housing support services to Medicaid services. The waiver will improve the
 expired "Housing Pilot" by including an enrolment and reimbursement option for
 supportive housing service providers. This initiative will help address housing
 support, which Lizette highlighted in her presentation as a top need. Housing has
 been identified as a significant area of need not only within SCR but across the
 state and nation.
- The Agency has been working to develop a tiered rate structure for Statewide Inpatient Psychiatric Program (SIPP) services. The rate structure will reflect individuals' disease acuity, and the resources needed for their care. The Agency expects to request additional appropriations for the new rates during the 2026 legislative session.
- The January RBHIC meeting will feature Courtney Whitt, Ph.D., Executive Director, of the Florida Center for Behavioral Health Workforce, through the College of Behavioral & Community Sciences at the University of South Florida. She will be discussing the work on workforce development and other exciting initiatives underway through USF.
- January RBHIC is a hybrid meeting at the Manatee County Goodwill, located at 2705 51ST Ave E, Bradenton, FL 34203, where the May 2024 RBHIC was held.
- 2026 RBHIC meetings will focus on tailored regional perspectives, how we can
 identify ways to strengthen community networks and cross-agency collaboration
 for better access to care, have availability of the needed services, and maintain
 quality behavioral health care. Are there areas that could be better supported by
 development of time-limited sub-collaboratives?
- Recommendations or ideas for sub-collaboratives:
 - Are there any promising practices you've seen that could be scaled up or sustained within your area of work?
 - What concrete measures or indicators are you currently using, or could begin using, to track progress and success over time?



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- Lunch and Learn sessions: In between RBHIC meetings, there are statewide Lunch and Learn sessions. Two have been held to date, Dr. Jay Reeve and Bikers Against Child Abuse, with session coming up in Dec. 2025 and 2026 (March, June, Sept., Dec.)
- We will continue to share success stories, begin to think on collaborative practices/initiatives across agencies- whether your own or other great work between agencies you have heard about.
