Suicide Safe

An app (for both Apple and Android platforms) designed for behavioral health & medical providers and is FREE. *Suicide Safe* puts SAMHSA's suicide prevention resources at health care providers' fingertips through a free mobile app for mobile devices and optimized for tablets. The app helps medical professionals identify suicide risk factors in their patients and connect them with mental health care.

It helps providers integrate suicide prevention strategies into their practice and address suicide risk among their patients. *Suicide Safe* is based on SAMHSA's *Suicide Assessment Five-Step Evaluation and Triage (SAFE-T)* card. <http://store.samhsa.gov/apps/suicidesafe/>
