Update on Scheduled Enhancements The group will discuss upcoming enhancements (SANDR, Expenditure Data, Spreadsheet Replacement, etc.) Next Regularly Scheduled Quarterly Release The FEI team is currently working on the following two enhancements that will be deployed into production on 11/1/2021:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create Ability to Enter Seclusion and Restraint Events (SANDR) (WI 316529) – Will require new XML format • Integrate OKTA and Enable Multifactor Authentication (WI 459635) <p>NOTE: These enhancements will include significant changes that will impact the field. To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The elimination of the requirement for a VPN to access the web site. (The team has not yet completed their technical analysis; however, it's likely a VPN will still be required for those who've been granted access to the base tables via SSMS.) • The introduction of multifactor authentication (MFA) via the Department's OKTA identity management system (https://www.okta.com/). <p>These enhancements are scheduled to be deployed into production on 11/1/2021.</p> <p>Vendors need time to migrate to new file format.</p> <p>Enhancement to Provide Better Tooling for Financial Reconciliation of SAMH Services Managing Entities submit details about services provided by their providers into FASAMS. They also submit invoicing details in a prescribed format to DCF. This enhancement will make it possible to submit or import the invoicing information into FASAMS and create reports that correlate what is invoiced with the supporting service details submitted into FASAMS. This will provide a more objective means to confirm the proper quantity of service data is being submitted into FASAMS and provide new opportunities to measure attributes of the data quality. Also included in this enhancement are improved financial reports that will assist SAMH's financial administrators. This enhancement is scheduled to be deployed into production on 2/1/2022.</p>																																										

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		<p>Enhancement to Provide Better Tooling and Support for ME Contract Management</p> <p>Some data required for the regions to effectively measure performance and manage the ME contracts is not include in FASAMS today (e.g. FIT, FACT, CAT, etc.) Most of this data is collected via spreadsheets. This enhancement will make it possible for MEs to submit this data into FASAMS and provide support to SAMH's data team to create new reports and dashboards that will be accessible to HQ, regional, and ME staff.</p> <p>This enhancement is scheduled to be deployed into production on 5/1/2022.</p> <p>New file formats will require implementation time Update frequency will need to be more controlled more carefully at TLH Data design will be important to mitigate the risk of frequent changes</p> <p>2. Changes to Scheduled Meetings</p> <p>The group will discuss potential new focused workgroups and reverting the frequency of the DAC back to a monthly meeting.</p> <p>SD – Level of care / level of functioning needs to be resolved.</p>
